




18. PLASTIC SURGERY WAS DEVELOPED AS CONSEQUENCE OF WWI INJURIES



This soldier lost his entire nose in the battle of Ypres. Through a cartilage rebuilding process, his nose was replaced. His scars were no longer visible years later.





15. LONDON'S GREAT WAR ZEPPELIN TERROR



The first zeppelin to bomb attack London appeared shortly after 11pm on May 31, 1915. Because of their great size, all zeppelin raids took place at night, making it harder for the defending guns and aircraft to locate them.

14. DEBUT OF USING AIRPLANES IN WARFARE

During the battle for Vimy Ridge, Canadian planes were equipped with wireless transmitters for reporting artillery target observations via Morse code in real time. Results were received on the ground instantaneously, allowing for faster artillery retargeting. It was one of the first airborne uses of wireless technology



12. SUFFRAGE THROUGH SERVICE

HOSPITAL UNITS FOR AMERICANS

Women Overseas Erect Buildings to Provide Care for Soldiers.

WILL TREAT GAS CASES

Doctors, Nurses and Aids Are Needed to Handle the Work.

NEW YORK, July 20.—A recent cable from France, received at the headquarters of the National American Woman Suffrage Association, announces that the French Government has assigned a 300-bed hospital for gas cases, to the Women's Oversea Hospitals, U. S. A. The French Scrylce de Sante will maintain the beds.

12. SUFFRAGE THROUGH SERVICE

- African-American women who tried to actively participate war efforts met huge obstacles
- The first black nurses to serve in the Army Nursing Corps were accepted during the influenza epidemic
 - Eighteen African-American nurses were accepted to assist with the epidemic in two training camps for African American soldiers, Camp Sherman in Ohio and Camp Grant in Illinois
- Nearly 200,000 black soldiers served overseas, no more than half a dozen black women employed by the YMCA managed to serve in France
 - The YMCA was the only volunteer organization which did not excluded black women from serving abroad
- Black women sought wartime employment and volunteered, but almost always in their own groups





Mabel Potter Dagget

- One of only six American journalists to be allowed to cover wartime activities in Paris and Reims in 1916
 - Pictorial Review a New York City publication with four million female readers
 - She got to the front by blackmailing the French press bureau La Maison de la Presse
- Author of Women Wanted: The Story Written in Blood Red Letters on the Horizon of the Great War (1918)




